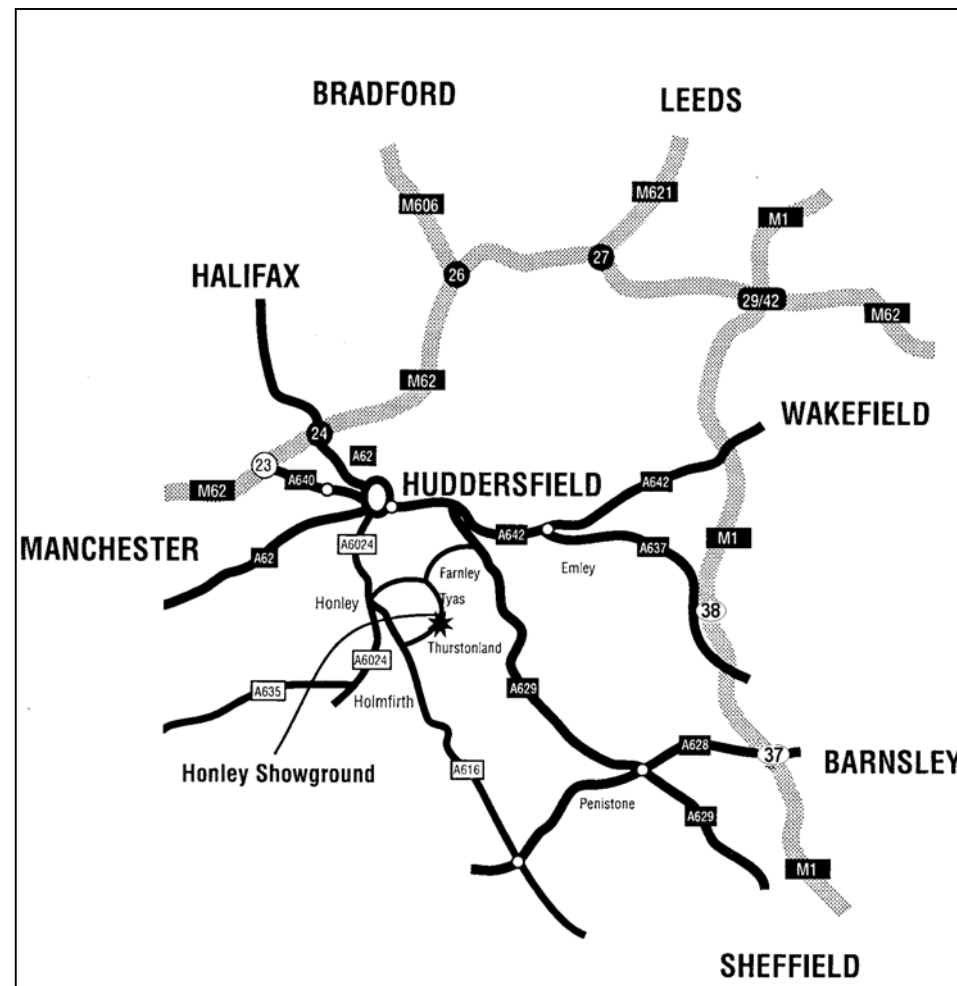

## DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in members' classes or competing for members' specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. 27th April 2009

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed Class, where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. Exemptions from this regulation are -

(1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under 12 months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed,

(2) A dog in Any Variety Veteran Class,

(3) As provided in the Kennel Club Definition of Classes

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(c) Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) Transfer

- (a) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or a Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, the Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of their being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height
- (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class

<u>Minor Puppy:</u>	For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show
<u>Puppy:</u>	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show
<u>Junior:</u>	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show
<u>Novice</u>	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
<u>Post Graduate:</u>	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not
<u>Open:</u>	For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.
<u>Veteran(7-10 yrs</u>	For dogs of not less than 7 years and under 10 years of age on the day of the show
<u>Veteran (over 10 yrs</u>	For dogs of not less than 10 years of age on the day of the show
<u>A.V.N.S.C</u>	For breeds of Dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 10.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required
3. Judging will commence at 10.30 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the show management.
6. The entry fees per dog will be £3.75 any number of entries
7. Prize Money - Best In Show - £50, Res Best in Show £25, Best Puppy in Show £25
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
11. **Best Puppy in Show** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of the Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show respectively.
  - 1) *Best Puppy in Group* Best puppy in group must be selected from those puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
  - 2) *Best Puppy in Show* Best puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners provided they are unbeaten by any other puppy.**Withdrawal from other Competition** Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition except Breed classes and Best Puppy in Breed prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes..

Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs
12. **Best in Show** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show.

*Best of Breed* Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed must be declared. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a Breed, a best of Sex must be selected from which the Best of Breed must be declared from those exhibits which have received an award.

  - a) *Shows judged on the Group System*
    - 1) Best of Group Best of Group must be selected from:
      - (a) The Best of breed winners in each group provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs
      - (b) The Best unbeaten winning dog from the any variety not separately classified classes in each group or on each day
    - 2) Best in Show Best in Show must be selected from the best of Group winners provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group Winners following the selection of Best in Show**Withdrawal from other Competition** Dogs which become eligible for Best of Group and Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than the Breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best of Group or Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best of Group or Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show

and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from Any Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes

Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition)
16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor
17. **Dogs in Cars on Hot Days**  
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
  - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
  - Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
  - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

**Please take care of your dog.**

**If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

18. Not for competition entries will not be accepted.
19. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry

## **Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F (Annex B)**

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
  - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulation will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at
  - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42
2.
  - a) No substance, which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat, may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance, which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog, may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
  - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition
3. No act or operation which alters the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
  - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
  - b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed
  - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered would be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. Any individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

## **Dogs in Cars on Hot Days**

**Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm.**

**Please take care of your dog.**

**If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.**

## **EXTRACTS FROM THE SOCIETY'S RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO EXHIBITORS AND EXHIBITS**

### **Schedules**

The Council shall approve and issue the Annual Show schedules setting out the classification, Judges and Prizes in respect of all sections and these shall be the basis of the contract between the Exhibitors and the Society. The Council reserves the right to correct any errors or omissions in the schedules.

### **Acceptance of Entries**

The Society, its Officers, Council and Servants will not be responsible for any loss (either wholly or in part), detention, injury of damage of or to any property exhibited or entered for competition or display at the show, or for injury, loss or damage caused to any persons or property whatsoever, or for any loss or damage, consequent on the non-staging or non-judging of any property entered for the show whether in any of the above cases the same arises from accident, disease, negligence or willful act omission of themselves or any other person or from any other cause whatsoever. Entries are accepted only subject to a condition that each exhibitor or competitor will indemnify and hold harmless the Society, its Officers Council and Servants against all claims, demands, actions and other liability, by or to any person arising from any cause whatsoever directly or indirectly connected with the presence, care, use, handling or transport of any property exhibited or entered at, or used in connection with the Show by such Exhibitor or Competitor.

### **Entries**

All entries, duly signed, must be received, together with the Entry Fess, by the appropriate Section Secretary, on or before the date fixed for the closing of entries. Exhibits must be the bonafide property and in possession of the Exhibitor on the date of entry and the Exhibitor must be prepared to provide proof of this should the Secretary request it. The council reserves the right to refuse any entry they may think fit.

### **Entry to Judging Enclosure**

No unauthorized person will be allowed into any ring while judging is in progress. The Handicraft and Poultry marquees will be closed to the public during judging.

### **Judging Arrangements**

The Council reserves the right to alter any judging arrangements they may consider necessary. In all cases the decision of the Judge shall be final, except in the case of an entry which is found to contravene these regulations or where misrepresentation has been made in connection with it. In such circumstances, the decision of the Council shall be final, subject to any overriding regulations of any specialist governing body.

### **Fire Hazard**

The use of any appliance involving a naked flame e.g. bottled gas stove, etc. is strictly forbidden.

### **Insurance**

All exhibitors should have Public Liability Insurance

### **Health and Safety at Agricultural Shows**

Exhibitors must agree to comply with such provisions of the Health and Safety Act at Work etc. Act 1974 and subordinate legislation as may apply to the Show.

### **Vehicles**

All vehicles must be moved from the show field to their designated parking area by 9.30 a.m.

### **Trophies**

Winners will be asked, when collecting their trophies to give their names and addresses and also sign a duplicate form or receipt. One copy of which will be given to the recipient. The receipt will state that if, upon request from the Society, the Trophy is not returned then regrettably legal action may be taken.

## **THE HONLEY SHOW SOCIETY LIMITED**
